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From the Editor

I hope everyone had a better summer (weatherwise) than that which blanketed the prairies for the first half of the season. I also trust everyone was able to play some skat and make it to a few tournaments this year. I myself was fortunate to play in three different venues this year: Montreal (but not for the Canadian Championship as I was called away to work), Winnipeg and my home town of Saskatoon. All three were tremendous fun, and I, hopefully like you, am planning to make it to Kelowna for the North American Championship in September.

The ISPA Canada board, club presidents and other member met in Montreal before the start of the tournament there and came up with a few changes and announcements. The two, which I believe to be the most significant, were the new guidelines for tournaments and the announcement of the host for the North American Championship in 2015.

Firstly, the entrance fees for tournaments was raised by \$10. It was also decided by an overwhelming majority that in the future only ISPA members in good standing may be called champion, should they happen to win the event. This also applies to a team which must consist entirely of ISPA members in order to win the title. Non-ISPA members who finish in such a spot which would entitle them to prize money would still qualify to win. This rule is similar to one which was introduced in the past which required the winner of the Canadian Championship to also be a Canadian resident.

Secondly, Texas has been awarded the honour of hosting the 2015 North American Championship. I will be able to pass more information about this as it becomes available, or simply visit the ISPA Canada website for the most update news. With this last topic in mind, as I mentioned before, I hope to see everyone in Kelowna in September; contact and venue information can be found on the link below. I wish everyone safe travels and Gut Blatt!

Do vou have a question for a referee?				

Here's one! Herbert, Bernd, Helmut and Walter are having a heated round and are getting ready to play hand 14 of their sheet. Helmut is the dealer, and, therefore, sitting this hand out. Helmut is seated between Herbert and Walter. After winning the bid, Bernd looks in the skat, announces Grand and leads out. Helmut thinks that the hand must be weak as he saw the two top jacks and two aces in Herbert's hand, who is to his left, and to satisfy his curiosity he looks into Walter's hand to see how much trouble Bernd is really in. Bernd sees this and immediately declares that he has won his game. The other players protest saying that Bernd is only trying to weasel himself out of a game which is will almost certainly lose. A referee is called. What is the correct decision?

ANSWER:

A violation has indeed occurred. According to I.S.K.O. 4.5.5 "Each player is to pick up and hold his cards so that other players cannot see them. It is also not allowed for other players to look into or to allow his cards to be revealed or divulged." It is something we do without thinking and take for granted quite often within our own skat clubs, but a rule which we should pay a little more attention to when in a tournament environment.
